

## The best hotels near Disneyland Paris

Opt for an all-singing, all-dancing place to stay within the park or inviting alternative just a swift shuttle ride or metro stop away

**D**isneyland Paris is only 40 minutes by RER train from central Paris but to retain the magic when exhaustion strikes at the end of the day, consider staying in situ. The resort itself has eight Disney hotels and seven partner hotels, with several more appealing places to stay just 15 minutes away by shuttle bus or train – overlooking fields, sporting outdoor pools, manicured French gardens, all sorts. Hotels are pricier the closer you get to the Disney action, climaxing with Disneyland Paris' flagship Disneyland Hotel, which recently re-opened after a royal facelift.

Many families reduce costs by splitting their stay: one night further afield and one night in a Disney hotel to bag early entry into the park, roll-out-of-bed encounters with Disney characters, the famous banquet of a bottomless breakfast spread and priceless convenience of being within walking distance of everything (after-dark drones and fireworks above Sleeping Beauty Castle included). Our pick of the best hotels near Disneyland Paris are all no more than 15 minutes on foot or 30 minutes by public transport from the park.

### How we review

Every hotel in this curated list has been visited by one of our expert reviewers, who are usually hosted on a complimentary basis. They stay for a minimum of one night, test at least one meal and trial other experiences that the hotel might have to offer.

### Hôtel l'Elysée Val d'Europe, Serris

This elegant townhouse-styled address, a five-minute train ride on RER A from the Park, is an eminently sensible choice for parents who'd rather not eat-sleep-dream Disney 24/7. On the café-framed square outside, dormer windows slotted into slate-grey mansard roof scream 'Paris!' and interior palettes of soothing taupe and soft green are the perfect antidote to a frenetic day at Disney. Public areas enjoy a peaceful, hushed vibe – kudos for the sunken mezzanine-lounge with circular sofa and glass conservatory awash with potted plants. The hotel has 152 rooms in all, spoiling families with connecting doubles or quadruples, triples and junior suites. If steak frites in steakhouse Le George or brasserie classics in Le Diplomate don't appeal, head out onto Place d'Ariane for the kids' pick of pizza, pasta or Asian.
